Full-Time Senior Missionary Opportunities

GENERAL INFORMATION

ASSIGNMENTS

Candidates for full-time missionary service should be willing to serve wherever and in whatever capacity they are called. Specific full-time assignments may be discussed with, and recommended by the Bishop and/or Stake President, but cannot be promised. Missionaries serving in the United States or Canada can serve 12, 18, or 23 months, but service outside of these areas would be 18 or 23 months.

Please note: You will NOT be assigned to a mission that costs more than you can afford, that does not have medical services you need, or that has dangerous conditions.

Live-at-Home Assignments

Seniors may serve full time and live in their own homes. Most of the assignments listed in this bulletin are available to those who desire to live at home.

Live-at-Home missionaries:

- Couples, single brethren or sisters.
- Serve at least 12 months, 32+ hours per week.
- For part time service, (less than 32 hours per week) see www.lds.org/csm/parttime
- Fill out the normal missionary recommendation forms except for the physical exams, dental exams and insurance forms. You will need to print forms from the online system and mail them. The couple should work with their stake president who then will arrange their service with the mission president or the missionary coordinators at Church headquarters.
- The call will come from the Prophet.
- Contact the senior missionary coordinators (see below) if you have further questions.

COSTS

All listed costs are only estimates for housing, food and transportation. They are based on the average of what previous couples have spent.

SENIOR SISTERS (40+)

Senior sisters are needed throughout the world. Those serving in mission offices, leadership, retention, proselyting, visitor centers and medical assignments participate in the equalization program and pay \$400.00 per month (plus \$120.00 per month for medical insurance, if needed). There are also opportunities for service in Temples, Family History and Church Headquarters at varying costs.

LANGUAGE TRAINING

Some foreign missions require no foreign language training. If you desire to learn some language skills it is only available pre-MTC and is delivered by telephone from the MTC upon your request once you have received a mission assignment.

Your bishop will forward the on-line forms to your stake president who will submit them to the Missionary Department, up to six months ahead of your available date.

Health Care Professionals

Immediate and on-going need for MDs, DOs, RNs, PAs, NPs, and mental health counselors for full time missionary service advising mission presidents on missionary health. Assignments available in Church Areas world wide include **USA/Canada, Central and South America, Europe, Africa, Asia and Pacific Islands**. Live-at-home service is also available. Duties include direct and telephone contacts with missionaries and mission presidents regarding health issues. Teaching preventive health care to missionaries is an important aspect of the service.

Retired Military Couples

Couples are greatly needed to serve at military training and operational bases throughout the United States and world-wide. Missionary responsibilities include: activation and retention of LDS trainees attending basic and advanced military training; assist local Church leaders in providing Church services to LDS trainees who are restricted to base as well as helping with military families of deployed service members; teach missionary discussions and new member lessons to investigators and converts; teach Institute classes to service members; organize Family Home Evening programs for single military members; and build bridges of understanding with military chaplains, commanders, and the base community. While not a requirement for serving, a Retired Military ID card is very important to gain access to military bases.

Senior couples may reside in their home near a military base, if they desire.

Recreational Properties

What you would do: The local unit auditor/trainer is a new priesthood calling to train stake/district and ward/branch priesthood leaders in their duties to handle sacred Church funds. Ongoing needs arise in areas throughout the Church, both in the United States (part-time service assignments) and in foreign countries (full-time). Currently, needs exist in the **South America South Area (headquartered in Buenos Aires, Argentina); New Zealand/ Pacific Islands Area (headquartered in Auckland, New Zealand), and the Africa West Area (headquartered in Accra, Ghana).** Spanish speaking skills are necessary for the South America South Area.

Who you report to: You will work closely with and report to the manager of member and statistical records in the local Church administration office.

Who should apply for this opportunity: Individuals with leadership, communication, analytical, and training skills, who have served in bishoprics, stake presidencies, or stake or ward clerk roles are ideal for this position. Financial, auditing or accounting experience is desirable, but not required. Church Headquarters in Salt Lake City will train couples for this service mission.

What your spouse would do: In international areas this service mission can be an opportunity with many possibilities for your spouse. She could assist with other Church departments such as Family History, Temple, Welfare and Humanitarian Service, as time permits. Your spouse could assist with printing reports, recording completed audits, and composing letters and email communications to local leaders.

Family and Church History Mission

This mission encompasses the Temple Square and Church Headquarters "campus".

As a Family and Church History Missionary you will have access to the resources of both the Family History Library and the Church History Library. During your first week, you will attend the Training Zone of the mission. Here the staff will give you general instruction on the work that goes on in the many zones of the mission as well as "one on one" computer familiarization training. Once you are assigned to a specific zone, you will receive additional instruction for that work area. A special bond is usually created between you and your co-workers that will last throughout your life.

There are apartments for missionary housing available within a short walking (0.3 mile) distance to the assigned work areas. Cost for the mission is \$900-\$1,000 for single sisters and \$ 1500-1600 for couples per month. Generally, there is a thirty-five to forty hour per week work schedule. Some of the zones require shift work. The Family History side of the mission includes several zones in the Family History Library working with patrons to assist them in their genealogical research. There are several other support zones involving indexing and processing names for the temples. The Church History side of the mission includes zones working in the Church History Library and the church

archives, doing historical research and summarizing journals and other records of historical interest. Other zones answer phone inquiries and e-mail questions coming from family history centers and individuals from around the world.

Most assignments require some computer skills and/or research skills. Experience with PAF, Temple Ready and Internet software programs is helpful. Other skills that are needed include college English and writing experience. Knowledge of a second language is often very helpful. Training programs to assist those less proficient and upgrade the more proficient missionaries are available. This assignment is also appropriate for members who live on the Wasatch Front and could serve as “Live-at- Home” missionaries.

Family History Missionaries working outside Salt Lake City further the work of the redemption of the dead in various capacities. They make it possible for those doing family history research to learn their duties and have the records they need.

Family History Support Missionaries

Family History Support missionaries train and support members, family history workers and leaders in various aspects of their family history responsibilities. Family History Support missionaries use Internet-based resources to provide support to family history consultants and others with family history callings. Family History Support missionaries may teach leaders the principles of administering family history programs in stakes and wards. Family History Support missionaries may help members and family history workers learn to use computer resources to do family history and provide ordinances for ancestors.

These assignments require basic computer and family

history skills. Experience using Church family history computer programs such as Personal Ancestral File, FamilySearch, and TempleReady is important. Some assignments require language.

All Family History missionaries receive comprehensive training relating to their assignments and work directly with local priesthood leaders and Family and Church History Department staff. In addition to their family history work assignment, they are encouraged to make themselves available to share the gospel with non-members, perform other types of service and participate in missionary activities as directed by the mission president. Their day-to-day supervisor for family history work will be a Church employee or local leader. Typical work week at assignment is 40 hours.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEPARTMENT

Temple and Special Projects Construction Accounting:

Missionary couples or individuals are needed to serve in Salt Lake City and at select Temple sites where construction of a new temple is beginning or is in process. The missionaries will work in the Finance Division of the Physical Facilities Dept. The responsibilities of the position include being part of a project team and providing financial support to the team which will consist of Church project managers, financial analysts and other support personnel for the project. This position will assist in ensuring the project operates according to the written contracts, reviewing of project pay requests, analyzing project data, and assisting the finance staff and project manager in other aspects of the project. Assistance

with similar responsibilities for meetinghouse construction projects may also be part of this assignment. Spouses without technical expertise may assist in other ways on the project if it is not located in Salt Lake City.
